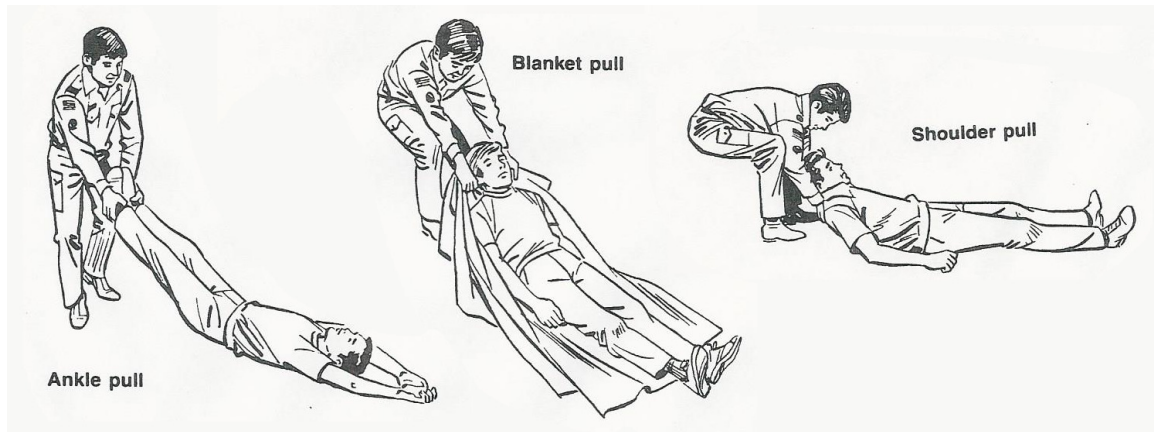




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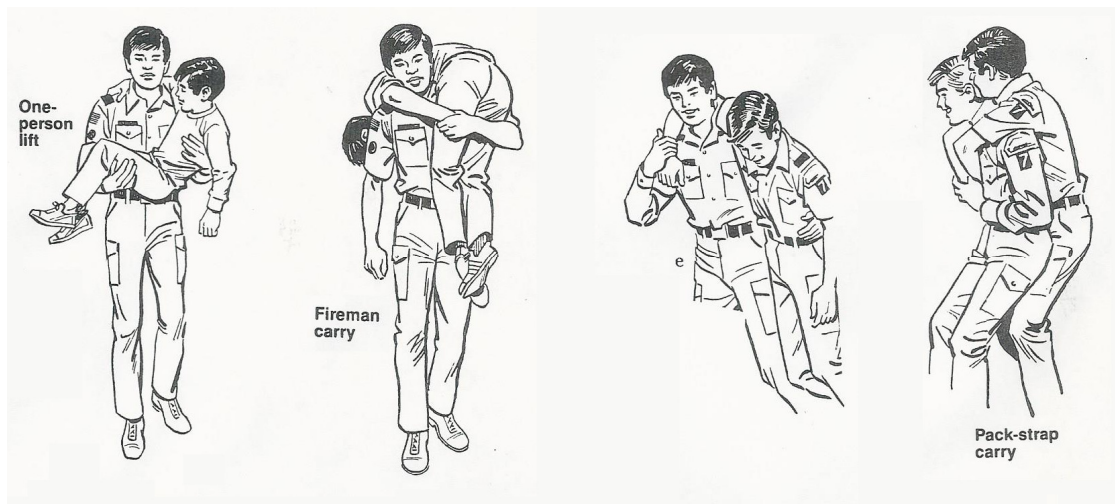
## First Class Requirement 7b Transporting an Injured Person

### By yourself - Smoke-filled room



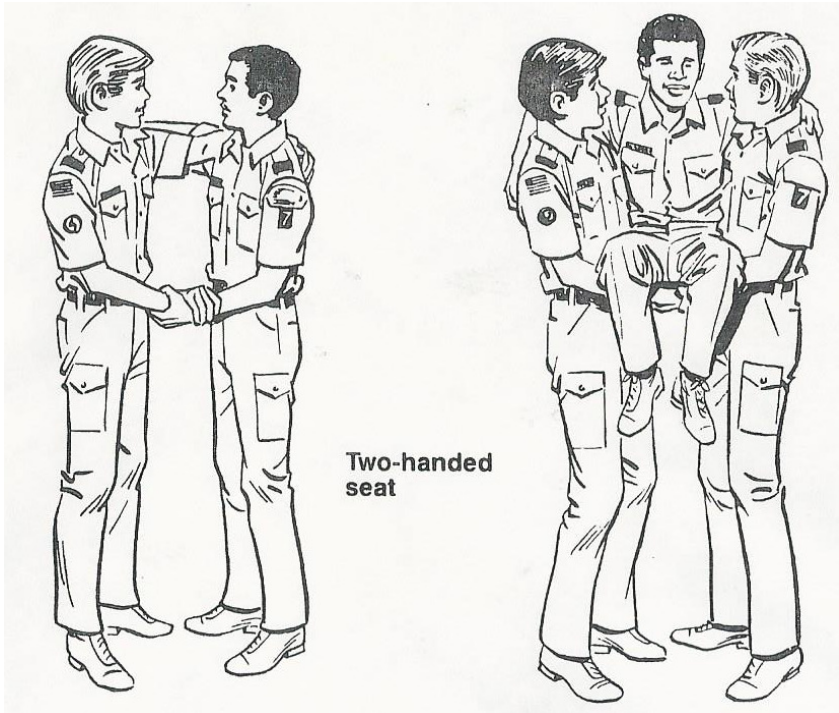
Blanket pull: Get your fists against the victim's ears.

### Some 1-man carries

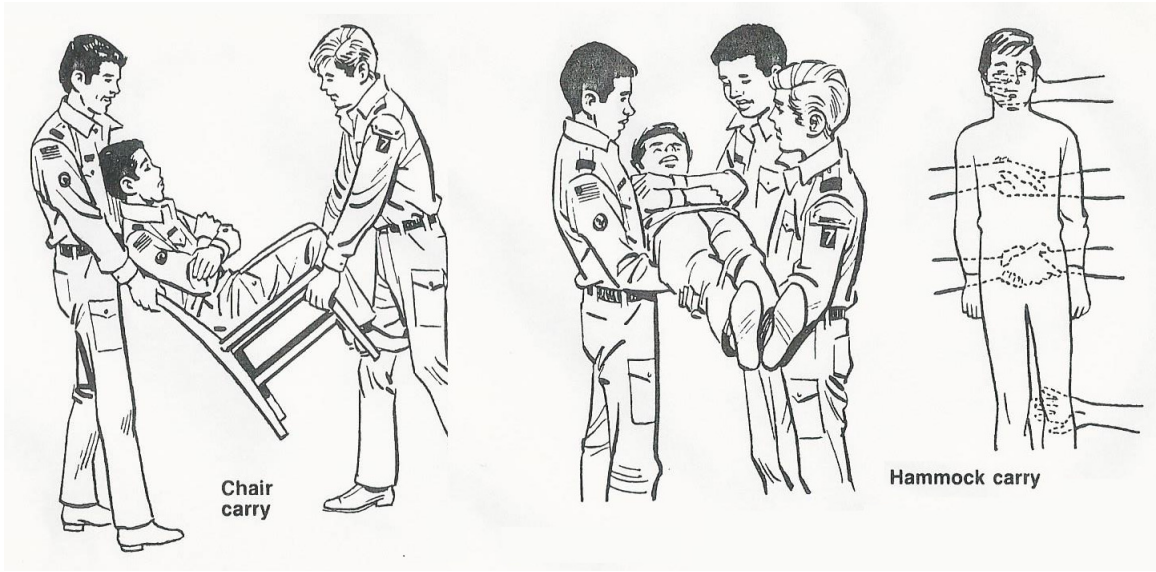


The pack-strap carry works even for a very heavy victim.

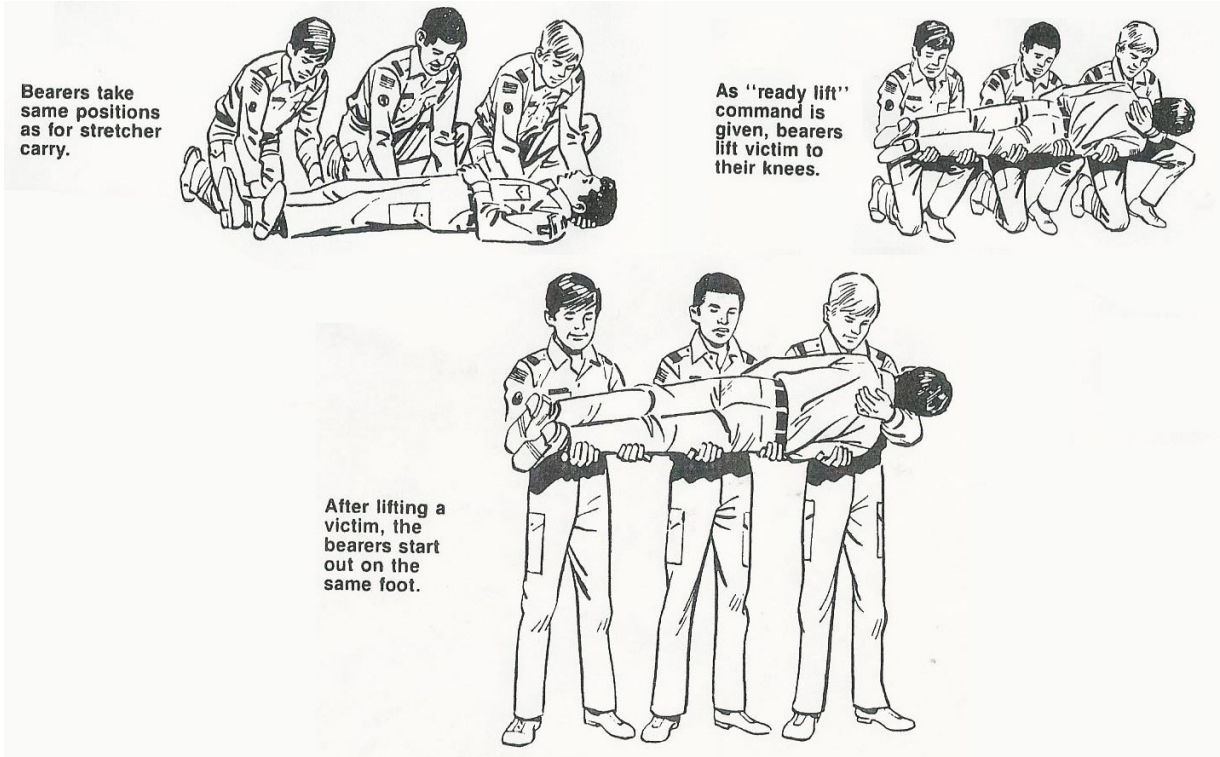
**Some 2-man carries (1)**



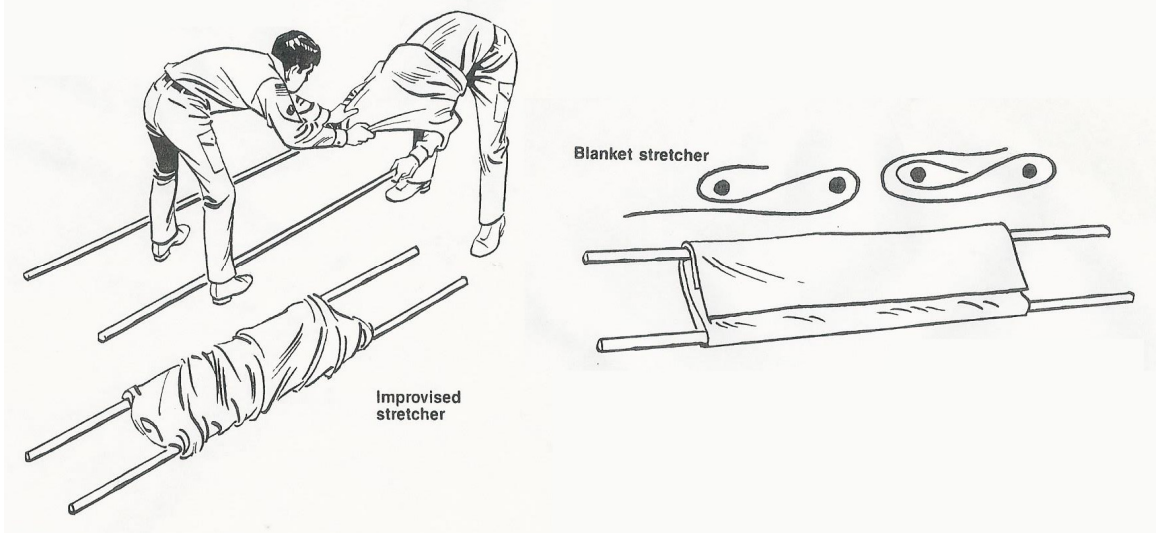
**Some 2-man carries (2)**



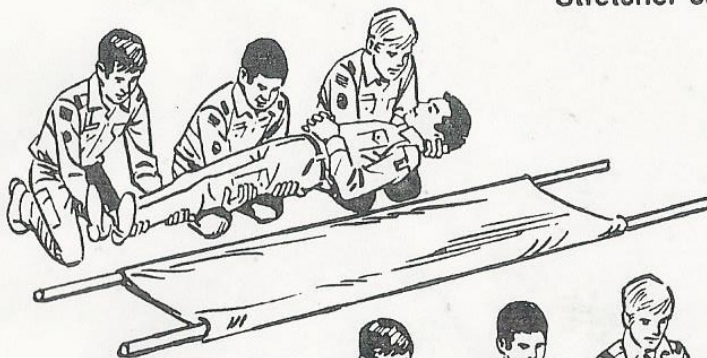
**3-man carry**



# Two Improvised Stretchers

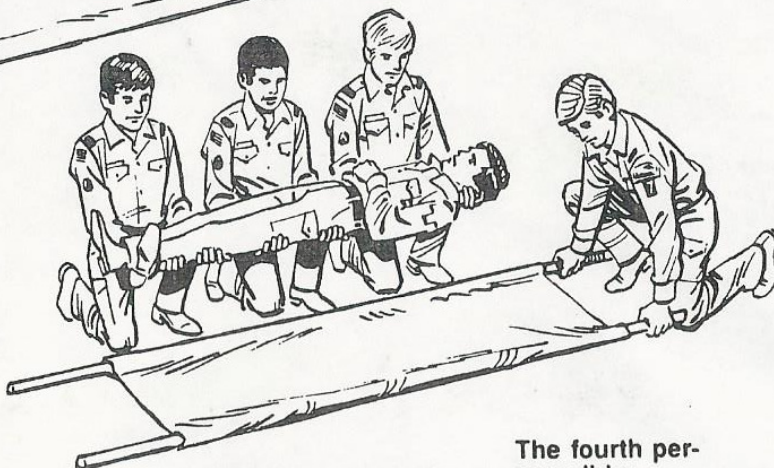


## Stretcher carry



Each man kneels on knee nearest the victim's feet.

As fourth person says, "ready lift," bearers lift the victim and rest him on their knees.



The fourth person slides stretcher close to bearers. "Lower" command is given, and victim is gently placed on stretcher.



One bearer gives "lift" command. When starting out, front and side bearers step off with left foot; rear bearer with his right foot.
